### Member Highlight- Ben Martin

Ben is a nuclear criticality safety (NCS) engineer at GE-Vernova in Wilmington, North Carolina. Ben received his B.S. in Nuclear and Radiological Engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology in 2019. After completing his degree, Ben began his NCS career working at Y-12 in the Manufacturing Operations group.



In that role, he supported various facilities and processes including machining, storage, and assembly/disassembly operations. He was the primary NCS author on Y-12's new Metal Purification Process, which utilizes Electrorefining to purify uranium. Ben presented on this topic at the ICNC 2023 Conference in Japan. Recently, Ben supported Y-12 as the lead NCS engineer for the Highly Enriched Uranium Materials Facility and on-site Special Nuclear Materials Transportation. This summer, Ben accepted a role with GE-Vernova to support their NCS and Integrated Safety Analysis group for their fuel manufacturing building as well as supporting the development of the Natrium Fuel Facility.

In the summer of 2020, Ben volunteered to join the NCS Division Program Committee as the Vice-Chair. In this role, he supported the Chair while learning the ropes. In 2022, Ben became the Chair of the Program Committee. His responsibilities in this role include organizing paper reviews and reviewers, development of the NCS program and agenda at each ANS Annual and Winter conference, plus Ben often organizes and chairs sessions within the Division. In his free time, Ben enjoys playing board games, reading, and playing basketball.

# Site Highlight- NCSD Young Member Subcommittee

Based upon a recommendation by NCSD Chair Fred Winstanley and inspiration from the UK Early Careers Criticality Safety Network (ESCN), the Division has recently chartered a new subcommittee targeted at students and young members.
